The lists are presented in order of Surname, after which the entries are sorted by Forename and then by Year. The Parish is indicated using the abbreviations shown in the table above. Most of the information in the records has been included in tabular form. As well as the expected Forename, Surname, Date and Parish, other columns have been created for:-

<u>Status:</u> this usually means Relationship, such as Son or Wife (of... see next column).

Relative(s): This shows the forename(s) of the parent(s) or husband of the deceased and his occupation if given. Widows may have not have any further details, even their own forename may not have been recorded. Where parents have different surnames, two burials may appear, one under each of the surnames.

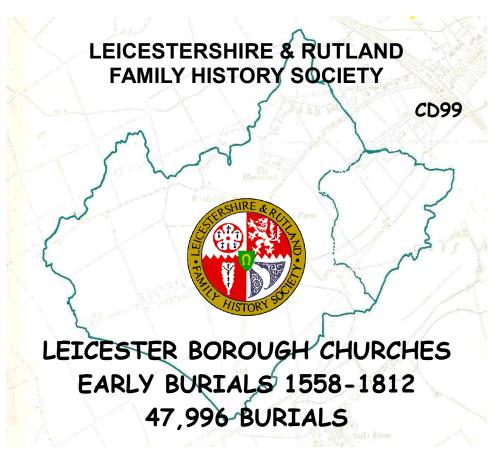
Age: This was only recorded for some periods and in some Parishes.

Notes: Where extra information is available, this has often been included here. Sometimes we have added explanations. Our additions are in square brackets [thus]. We have used this to show any occupation mentioned, except where the record reads (e.g.) 'William, son of John Smith, Tailor', in which case we have assumed that the father was the Tailor and put this in the Relative(s) column. Where an entry was difficult to read, we may have indicated this, and users should check the original in the Local Record Office.

Where an entry is very unclear, we may have declined to guess and shown a query, "?".

Where information is missing, you may see a dash "-".

Where an entry has an unlikely spelling, the note may show [SIC], Latin for "thus".
